Our anti-racism consultant, Jessica Vasquez-Torres, named the community organizing process and specifically one-on-one meetings as one helpful way for us to begin to build connection and community.

One of the great needs we have in PSNE is relationship building. The Roundtable would like us to use One-on-One's at the beginning of each meeting for 20 minutes. You will be randomly paired with someone and given a question to talk about together (10 minutes each).

The question for our November meeting is this:

**What is breaking God's heart in the community
you live in *and* what do you feel called to do
about this as a disciple of Jesus Christ?**

Just relax and get to know one another. This is simply a first step towards building deeper relational muscles in our Presbytery as we prepare to go deeper in 2022 in our ministry and leadership. We invite all committees of the Presbytery to also include this practice into their monthly meetings.
